

Table 1 shows the major distinctions between these five publication types to help guide the author on the selection of the right template type.








Knowledge Sharing






Staff Feedback on Yammer (KM survey)

Infrequent users: what would make you use Yammer more?


Infrequent Yammer Users (n=173)





Why a community of practice


